

EMERGENCY REPORTING GUIDE

You must report immediately:

- if there is a leak or spill exceeding the amount shown in the Reporting Quantities table (below)
- if there is damage to a truck or large container that could result in a leak or spill exceeding the reporting quantities, *or*
- if, as a result of an incident, there is a need to transfer dangerous goods from one large container to another

You must notify immediately:

- your employer
- the owner of the vehicle
- the shipper, *and*
- the authorities listed in the Immediate Notification table (below)

Reporting Quantities

Class	You must report a leak or spill of:
1 Explosives	Any quantity that could pose a danger <i>or</i> more than 50 kg
2 Gases	Any quantity that could pose a danger <i>or</i> a sustained release of 10 minutes or more
3 Flammable Liquids	More than 200 litres
4 Flammable Solids, Spontaneously Combustible, Dangerous When Wet	More than 25 kg
5.1 Oxidizers	More than 50 kg or 50 litres
5.2 Organic Peroxides	More than 1 kg or 1 litres
6.1 Toxic Substances	More than 5 kg or 5 litres
6.2 Infectious Substances	Any quantity
7 Radioactives	Any quantity that could pose a danger
8 Corrosives	More than 5 kg or 5 litres
9 Miscellaneous	More than 25 kg or 25 litres
